

# What to do in a fire, flood or other emergency

Steps to take if your facility is threatened by an emergency

## When are warnings issued?

**Stay alert to emergencies affecting your community.**

Warnings are issued if an emergency is occurring that may threaten life or property.

### Advice



An incident is occurring or has occurred in the area. Access information and monitor conditions.

### Watch and Act/Warning



An emergency is heading towards you. Conditions are changing and you need to take action now to protect yourself and your family.

### Emergency warning



You are in imminent danger and need to take action now. You will be impacted.

Stay alert to emergencies affecting your community. Read your emergency management plan and know what you can do in an emergency to protect the safety and wellbeing of residents and staff.
